Welcome to the new school year!

I trust you have had an enjoyable festive season. To all those new young men starting at New Plymouth Boys' High this year, we warmly welcome you and your whānau.

This year, we are implementing changes to NCEA Level 1. As a school, we have been preparing for this for several years with professional learning of the new standards and modifying the junior curriculum to prepare students for NCEA. A new requirement in the future will be for students to pass a literacy and numeracy test before they gain an NCEA qualification. Whānau can help their sons prepare for this literacy requirement by encouraging boys to spend time reading each evening.

The school will also see a lot of property development throughout the year. The Library will move from the Cramond Block into Pridham Hall. The Library in Pridham Hall will also allow it to be used as a breakout space for the English classrooms around it. The character of Pridham Hall will be preserved; the direction to the architect was to be able to break down the space to allow it to revert to a hall within thirty minutes.

Te Haumarū Learning Centre is the department that caters to those with special educational needs including our gifted and talented students. It was located on the third floor of the French-Wright Block and has been moved to a purpose built area in the Cramond Block.

The Technology Metal and Visual Arts Block will finally undergo renovation in 2024, which has been in the planning stage for the last six years.

At the end of 2023, we trialled removing students' phones within the classroom. It was very successful and improved student engagement within the class. We plan to

implement this throughout the school in 2024. Students will be asked to hand in their phones at the beginning of each class, which will be returned at the end of the lesson. Any non-compliance of the rule by the student will be elevated to the Senior Leadership Team.

Recently, there has been significant media coverage about student attendance. We know there is a direct relationship between attendance and success at school. As whānau, we need your support in ensuring your son has excellence attendance at NPBHS.

We communicate weekly through the engagement report about your son's engagement in class, and in 2024, it will report on your son's attendance against the Ministry of Education's expectations. Please take time each week to read the engagement report email about upcoming events and the actual report. If you have any concerns about a subject, please contact the teacher or, for the overall report, the house dean.

We also have several house competition days for swimming, athletic sports, and house singing throughout the year. These events are an important part of developing house and school comradery, and there

is an expectation that all students attend. Those students who show continued non-attendance at these events will have a meeting with me as Headmaster.

We invite parents/caregivers and students of Year 9 students to a New Parent Orientation Afternoon on Thursday 22 February. This will start by displaying some of the extra-curricular activities available at NPBHS in Ryder Hall and then an opportunity to talk to your son's Huia rōpū teacher.

It is very pleasing that New Plymouth Boys' High School is the choice for so many. I look forward to leading in a way encouraging young men to 'Be the Example'.

The first days of the school year

Monday 5 February

Year 9 students:

If you have to go out for an appointment.



Yr12 Leadership Programme

The school operates a very comprehensive Leadership Programme that culminates in the selection of the student leaders for Year 13. In September, a group of potential leaders were selected for an overnight camp. The selection of the group is decided by staff and the opinion of their peers. From this group, 12 were selected to have a panel interview for 45 minutes and then six were selected to make a presentation to a full staff meeting.

Reporting

Engagement Report

The school will continue to email a weekly engagement report to parents/caregivers and students. This report evaluates your son's level of engagement in each of his classes on a scale of one to five. (1 = poor to 5 = excellent) The engagement grade means the willingness of a student to participate in classroom activities in a sustained and positive way.

Academic Progress Report

At the conclusion of Terms 1, 2, and 3, parents and students will be emailed an academic progress report. This measures the level of academic progress during the term. If parents wish to contact a teacher about progress in a particular subject, teachers emails are provided within the report.

School Portal

Teachers will continue to publish students' results via the KAMAR student portal and parents are able to monitor the progress of their son in various internal assessments and tests. The portal also shows senior students' progress towards achieving the various levels of NCEA.

SCHOOL UNIFORM RULES

How to wear your uniform at school, and to and from school.

- Hair should be clean, groomed, a natural colour of no more than moderate length, off the collar and away from the eyes. Extreme styles such as: dreadlocks, braids, No1's, mohawks, colours, hair-ties, raised hair, stripes, or rats' tails are unacceptable.
- Hat: only uniform shop hats able to be worn. Hats must not be worn inside.
- Facial hair: must be clean shaven.
- Headphones: only bud-type headphones allowed and can only be used at interval and lunchtime.
- Shirt to be tucked in at all times. No t-shirts under school shirt.
- School jersey: no holes or other black tops.
- Socks must be pulled up over the calf and to the knee.
- The NPBHS school jacket is the only jacket to be worn with the school uniform. A full-length raincoat may be used to and from school if raining. No hoods to be worn inside.
- No jewellery allowed other than a wristwatch and no visible piercing.
- Phones: no phones to be used in classes or assemblies.
- Shoes: black dress shoes - must take a shine (not canvas) or black leather sandals with backstrap up.
