## RATIONALE :

NPBHS undertakes to consult regularly so that the School, in its delivery of educational outcomes for students, reflects the desires and aspirations of parents, caregivers and the wider-community.

## PURPOSE :

1. To inform the school's community of proposed developments in curriculum and qualifications.
2. To gain feedback on the level of satisfaction felt by the community about school attainment of its goals and objectives.
3. To gain feedback on the strategic direction of the school.
4. To establish the demographic profile of the school's community.
5. To gain feedback on proposed development of the school's physical environment and facilities.
6. To maintain contact with business, sporting, cultural and service groups in the community.
7. To maintain links with Old Boys' throughout New Zealand and overseas, valuing their perspective on school developments.

## GUIDELINES :

1. Maintain a file at the school office and on the website of the current strategic plan and policies so the community has access to them.
2. Conduct surveys (Keep, Stop, Start) of the school community every 3-4 years with regards to school performance and to inform the strategic planning cycle.



3. Call special meetings for the school community, or special groups, from time to time as developments requiring consultation and feedback arise.
4. Ensure that consultation occurs with hostel parents, both at school and in their local areas, to get their views on current policies and practice.
5. The Board of Trustees and staff are available for formal and informal consultation both within the working day, and at sporting, cultural, or social occasions.
