EXCITING DEVELOPMENTS FOR 2025:

This year brings some fantastic developments across the school:

- **The Gully Turf Project:** Work is well underway on New Zealand's first artificial watered turf, located on our iconic Gully Ground. This cutting-edge surface will elevate sport at NPBHS while ensuring the Gully remains one of the best school sporting venues in the country.

THE FIRST DAYS OF THE SCHOOL YEAR

Monday 3 February

Year 9 students:

Meet on the Top Field (first entrance on the left as you travel up the hill) at 8:40 am. You will be welcomed into Ryder Hall with a pōwhiri. Whānau who wish to be formally welcomed as part of the pōwhiri are warmly invited to stay.

The first day is an orientation for new students, guided by the Year 13 student leaders. Year 9 students should bring their 'First-Year Student' Handbook, which was posted in December. Note that phones cannot be connected to the Wi-Fi; the device must have a screen size larger than 20 cm.

STUDENT SERVICES

School Nurse Rachel Jean and Attendance Officer Lisa Krahagen can help you if you:

- You don't know where to go or what day it is. Check the day number outside Student Services.
- You've lost your timetable. We can direct you to your correct classroom.
- You're late to school. Report to Student Services to sign in. If after 9:00am, a note or call from your caregivers is required.
- You have an appointment. Caregivers need to contact the school or provide a note. Student Services will print you a pass to leave.
- You need notices. Find the Daily Notices and other important updates in Student Services, including sports registrations.
- You've lost something. Ask us, we may have it.
- You left something behind. If it's lunch, PE gear, or a musical instrument, we'll hold it for you.
- You need a phone. There's a phone in Student Services for your use.
- You're sick or injured. Report to the school nurse. If needed, she'll contact your caregiver. For health concerns, the school nurse can provide confidential advice and referrals.

WORK DAY - FRIDAY 7 MARCH

REPORTING

Engagement Report

The school will continue to email a weekly engagement report to parents/caregivers and students. This report evaluates your son's level of engagement in each of his classes on a scale of one to five. (1 = poor to 5 = excellent) The engagement grade means the willingness of a student to participate in classroom activities in a sustained and positive way.

Academic Progress Report

At the conclusion of Terms 1, 2, and 3, parents and students will be emailed an academic progress report. This measures the level of academic progress during the term. If parents wish to contact a teacher about progress in a particular subject, teachers emails are provided within the report.

School Portal

Teachers will continue to publish students' results via the KAMAR student portal and parents are able to monitor the progress of their son in various internal assessments and tests. The portal also shows senior students' progress towards achieving the various levels of NCEA.

SCHOOL UNIFORM RULES

Guidelines for wearing your uniform at school and when travelling to and from school.

- Hair should be clean, groomed, a natural colour, of no more than moderate length, off the collar and away from the eyes. Extreme styles such as: dreadlocks, braids, No1's, mohawks, mullets, colours, hair ties, raised hair, stripes or horsies/rattails are unacceptable.
- Hat: only uniform shop hats able to be worn. Hats must not be worn inside.
- Facial hair: must be clean shaven.
- Headphones: only bud-type headphones allowed and can only be used at interval and lunchtime.
- Shirt to be tucked in at all times. No t-shirts under school shirt.
- School jersey: no holes or other black tops.
- Socks must be pulled up over the calf and to the knee.
- The NPBHS school jacket is the only jacket to be worn with the school uniform. A full-length raincoat may be used to and from school if raining. No hoods to be worn inside.
- No jewellery allowed other than a wristwatch and no visible piercing.
- Shoes: black dress shoes - must take a shine (not canvas) or black leather sandals with backstrap up.
